

Why the need for a Transdisciplinary assessment?

Transdisciplinary Approach

Bruder (1994), “This approach integrates a child’s developmental needs across the major developmental domains” and “involves a greater degree of collaboration than other service deliver models” (pg 61).

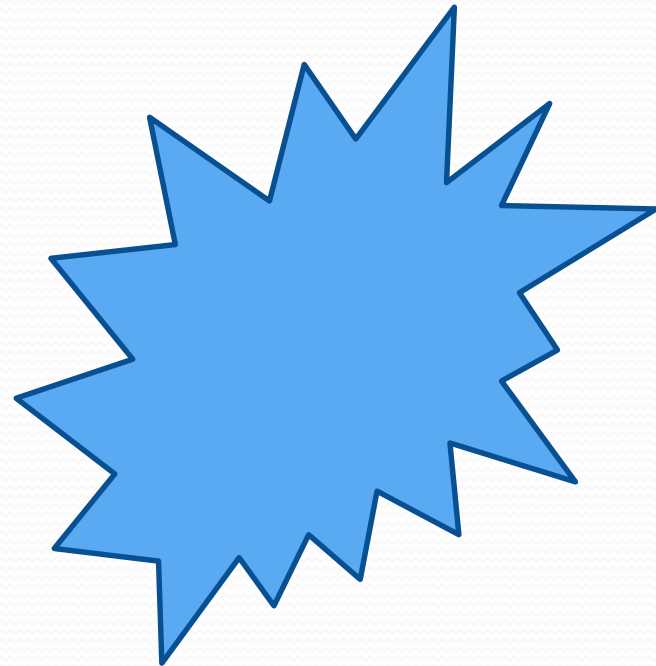
TRANSDISCIPLINARY CONT'D

Bruder (1994), “A transdisciplinary approach requires the team members to share rolls and systematically cross discipline boundaries. The primary purpose of this approach is to pool and intergrade the expertise of team members so that more efficient and comprehensive assessment and intervention services may be provided. The communication style in this type of team involves continuous give and take between all members (especially with the parents) on a regular basis. Professionals from different disciplines teach, learn, and work together to accomplish a common set of intervention goals for a child and her family. The role differentiation between disciplines is defined by the needs of the situation rather than by discipline - specific characteristics. Assessment, intervention, and evaluation are carried out jointly by designated members of the team. This team work usually results in a decrease in the number of professional who interact with the child on a daily basis.

SOCIAL PERSPECTIVE

- AMC worksite: Socially and verbally a “Film Crew” member is expected to:
 - - Smile and greet customers
 - - Ask customer what they’d like.
 - - Answer questions regarding show times and prices
- Comics –n –Stuff: Greet boss
- -Greet co-workers
- -Greet customers and offer help.
- -Provide opinions on a comic series or story when asked.
- -Restate and paraphrase verbally presented directions

- -Confirm with boss/supervisor that the directions are understood
- -re-state/paraphrase

SENSORY PERSPECTIVE

- AMC worksite: Adjustment to changes in light level from the darkened auditorium to the main theater area
- -adequate lighting throughout the dining area and backroom
- -noise from machines such as refrigerator, blender, etc.
- Comics- N- Stuff:-low to adequate lighting within the store
- -low background music
- -movement opportunities when climbing up and down the ladder, cleaning windows, dusting and sweeping
- - space is available should sensory break be needed
